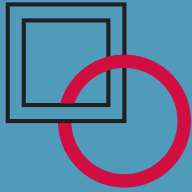

## Association for Careers Education and Guidance: Annual Conference 2010

During the last couple of years, in both England and Wales, there have been major changes for careers education. This has provided an opportunity to rethink, re-invigorate and explore new innovative ideas to develop careers education and career related programmes, for learners from age 7 to 19 years old.

In England:

- Statutory Guidance: Impartial Careers Education (DCSF 2009) and the accompanying Resource materials (DCSF 2010) which includes a new Careers Framework 7-19

In Wales

- Careers and the world of work: a framework for 11-19 year olds in Wales (DCELLS, 2008)

### Conference Aims

- To promote Careers Education and IAG (CEIAG) as an essential component of Economic Wellbeing and Financial Capability in the primary and secondary curriculum in England
- To promote Careers and the world of work (CWW) as an essential component in the secondary curriculum in Wales
- To look at the changing nature of learning and work and the innovative ways in which the role of CEIAG/CWW can prepare 7-19 year olds for the changing nature of work

### To achieve these aims, the Conference will include:

- keynote speakers who are contributing to the development of CEIAG in England and CWW in Wales
- optional workshops that focus on examples of good practice in a range of activities
- an exhibition of resources available to support CEG, IAG, EWFC and CWW
- networking opportunities for delegates to share concerns and areas of common interest
- an opportunity to contribute to the Association's policies
